If you have problems getting this into your school feel free to contact any of the board members at any time. We would love to help you.

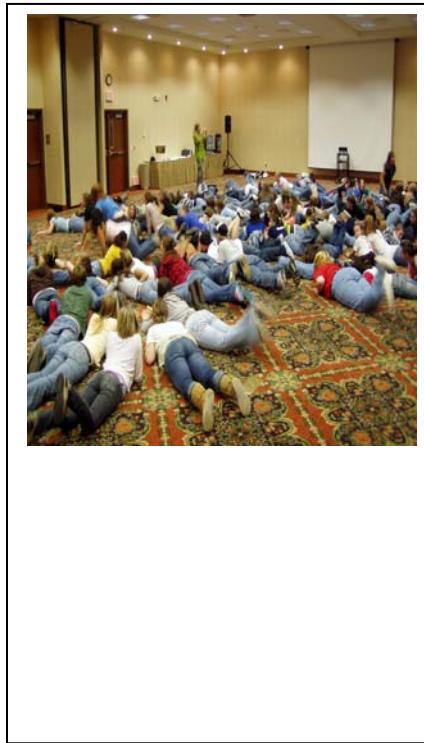
